

Rules

1. Legal Liability – Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of the event to which these rules apply, nor the British Horse Society, nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, vehicle or their contents and accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever.
2. The event is organised in accordance with the Health & Safety Legislation and all who have control of the premises or site at the event are responsible for ensuring that everything reasonably practicable is done to ensure the health and safety and welfare of those attending the event. They conduct themselves to that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk. Access to and egress from the site is safe. Booklet, if required, stating Health & Safety rules, available at Secretary's tent. Emergency services must have access to all parts of the event site at all times.
3. *Competitors must be correctly dressed for the event. Hats to new standards EN1384 or PAS015 must be worn at all times when mounted. Hat prefixed with either SEI or ASRM are the American standards and are also acceptable. Correct footwear must be worn.*
4. Judges' decisions are final and no entry fees will be refunded unless the class is cancelled.
5. Any member of Bath Riding Club Committee, Judge or Steward has the right to ask any rider or persons abusing the use of whip or spurs, using ill fitting or dangerous tack or acting in an offensive manner to leave the field forfeiting all fees.
6. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry, cancel classes, divide or amend any class or restrict the number of entries in any class.
7. No Horse/Pony under the age of 4 years may compete.
8. All dogs must be kept on leads.
9. Parking – please park sensibly where requested making sure not to block any access. Please do not leave hay and droppings in the parking areas.

WITHDRAWALS: In the event of any withdrawals, the organisers regret that they cannot refund entry fees after the close of entries

BAD WEATHER: It is the responsibility of the competitors to check with the organiser if weather is inclement.

Class 1	Minimus Novice	Fences less than 1'9 Restricted to those combinations not to have been placed 1 st – 3 rd in any jumping competition. May be led.
Class 2	Minumus Open	Fences approx 2'0 Open to all
Class 3	Open Jumping	Fences approx 2'3
Class 4	Open Jumping	Fences approx 2'6

Class 5 **Novice Top Score Qualifier (Juniors and Seniors)**
Fences from 2'0 – 3'0 joker fence

*Incorporating Royal Windsor Horse Show Qualifier – The top 3 placed eligible junior and senior riders to qualify directly for Royal Windsor Horse Show. To qualify you must be a member of an Area 9 riding club. Non members can compete but will not qualify.
Rider to have no BSJA winnings in the last five years*

Class 6 **Intermediate Top Score Qualifier (Juniors and Senior)**
Fences from 2'3 - 3'3 joker fence

*Incorporating Royal Windsor Horse Show Qualifier – The top 3 placed eligible junior and senior riders to qualify directly for Royal Windsor Horse Show. To qualify you must be a member of an Area 9 riding club. Non members can compete but will not qualify.
Rider to have no more than £175 BSJA winnings in the last five years*

Class 6 **Open Jumping** Fences approx 3'0

What is Top Score?

A number of different jumps will be constructed within the height range for the class. Each fence will be capable of being jumped in either direction. The course plan will show how many points each fence is worth (from 20 – 200). Each fence may be jumped twice. The rider will have 60 seconds from the bell to get the maximum points they can. For all fences except the Joker, points will be awarded for them being cleared but no points will be awarded if any part of the fence is dislodged. Knocked down fences will not be rebuilt and no points will be gained if a knocked down fence is jumped. The Joker fence will be the maximum height and is worth a maximum of 200 points. However, if any part of the Joker fence is dislodged, 200 points will be deducted from the riders score. The bell will ring when the 60 seconds is up.

Does my horse need to be vaccinated to qualify?

Horses and Ponies need to comply fully with equine influenza requirements (Rule G7) for the qualifier.

Am I and my horse eligible for the top score competition?

Novice: Rider to have no BSJA winnings within the last five years
Intermediate: Rider to have won no more than £175 BSJA in the last five years

Each rider must be a member of an affiliated BRC club in Area 9 to qualify but non members may still take part.

What about tack?

Usual BRC showjumping rules apply.
